Operating Policy

4.0 CLUB OPERATIONS

Shooting Clubs affiliated with and sanctioned by the White Mountain Shooters Association may conduct supervised shooting matches at the Second Knoll Target Range pursuant to WMSA By-Laws and Range Rules. It is the responsibility of Club leadership to ensure all WMSA requirements are met, waivers and fees are collected and operations are conducted safely. A Club may reserve up to three bays for a planned competition by contacting the Baywatch bay scheduling committee in advance. Any group wanting to add an available fourth bay to an existing reservation may contact the committee no sooner than one week (7 days) prior to the needed date. If the bay is available at that time, the committee may approve the fourth bay use.

4.1 CLUB FORMATION AND REVIEW

- A. All Clubs conducting matches at the Second Knoll Target Range must be approved by the WMSA BOD. Pursuant to WMSA By-Laws, Clubs must have at least ten members, five of which must be WMSA members. Additionally, Clubs must identify a recognized organization (such as NRA, USPSA, CMP, SASS, etc.) which has published safety rules, objectives and goals for the organization. Alternatively, a Club may submit a written plan with safety rules, objectives and goals to the BOD for approval and sanction by WMSA.
- B. Each Club is responsible for electing a WMSA Representative who will be a member of the BOD.
 1. An annual review of each Club will be conducted by the WMSA Representative each June and certified to the WMSA President, prior to the WMSA Annual Meeting, to verify the activity of each Club and confirm its active status.
 2. Failure to maintain minimum qualification requirements may result in loss of BOD representation, however Clubs whose membership and/or activity is lacking may continue to conduct matches at the Second Knoll Target Range pending BOD approval.

4.2 CLUB MATCHES

Subject to the terms of Range Policy 4.0 Club Operations, the following guidelines will be followed during Club Matches.

A. Fees and Documentation

1. Clubs are responsible for ensuring that all shooters and spectators sign in on a Daily Range Report. Shooters must pay the daily range fee required by WMSA and any additional fees charged by the Club.
2. All shooters and spectators must have a current signed waiver on file or sign one prior to the start of a Club match

B. The Daily Range Report and daily use fees will be left at the WMSA office on the public range at the conclusion of the event unless other arrangements have been made.

C. Firearms and Targets

1. Safety is the primary consideration in all Club matches.
2. A WMSA certified RSO or a 'club specific' RSO must supervise Club matches.
3. Club matches may use various firearms and procedures applicable to the specific shooting discipline which are not permitted on the Public Range.
4. Club matches may also use various targets applicable to the specific shooting discipline which are not permitted on the Public Range, such as custom steel targets and ground or aerial targets that do not rise above the berm.
5. All ranges and bays will be left clean of debris and brass after each event. Trash may be deposited in the WMSA dumpster located adjacent to the Public Range.

4.3 CLUB SUPPORT

To support WMSA's objective of operating the Second Knoll Target Range for recreational shooting, WMSA will endeavor to provide support to the various sanctioned shooting clubs. That support comes in a variety of forms.

A. Facility

1. Offices for check in/registration.
2. Trash Receptacles.
3. Porta-Potties.

B. Equipment /Targets

1. WMSA may fund a portion of initial startup equipment costs to facilitate formation of specialty Clubs upon BOD approval.
2. WMSA may assist in the purchase of durable targets, target frames or other specialized equipment for use by Clubs. Each Club BOD representative may present their requests, including details and costs, to the monthly BOD Meeting for approval.
3. WMSA will generally not assist in the routine purchase of consumable items such as paper or cardboard targets.

Durable items purchased with WMSA funds shall be marked and identified with "WMSA." These items are intended for use by the Club, but remain the property of WMSA
